Reasons To enable Melton to participate in a countywide scheme that will enable Broadband access across the Borough. Superfast Broadband is needed to improve consumer power and choice, overcoming rural isolation and for the Borough to be able to be competitive in the business field.

The council's contribution is part of an overall £7m secured from LCC and central government.
