LEICESTERSHIRE TOGETHER ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSIONING HUB

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To inform members of the newly formulated countywide over arching environmental group the Leicestershire Together 'Environmental Commissioning Hub'

3.0 KEY ISSUES

- 3.1 Leicestershire Together is a partnership made up of the county's 8 local councils, the NHS, the Police, the Leicestershire Fire and Rescue Service, the Chamber of Commerce, the Learning and Skills Council, Connexions, the equivalent Leicester City Partnership and the voluntary sector. The aim of the partnership is to improve the infrastructure and lives of the county and its residents.
- 3.2 During 2010 Leicestershire Together requested that one of the counties foremost environmental groups ENABLE (Environmental Action For A Better Leicestershire) undertake a review of all the various environmental partnerships and other similar groups within Leicestershire.
- 3.3 The review considered each partnership and group in terms of its purpose effectiveness and efficiency and determined that a better way of steering and overseeing strategic environmental and sustainable development within the county was achievable
- 3.4 One of the main outcomes from that review was a view that a number of the counties environmental groups and partnerships over lapped, had become ineffective, had lost direction or had become primarily forums for debate.
- 3.5 As a result Leicestershire Together determined that a new single over aching body the Leicestershire Together 'Environmental Commissioning Hub' (ECH) be formed.
- 3.6 The ECH has being established to:
 - Provide strategic overview and direction for the groups reviewed within a single overarching body
 - Create a single body able to embrace and co-ordinate action and development for the various and wide ranging aspects of environmental service delivery and activity within the county
 - Allow for joined up environmental development aims and objectives
 - Provide a forum in which strategic synergies and interrelationships can be debated
 - Determine the extent, nature and benefits of pooling or joining up budgets with reference to shared services and joint working opportunities
