**Background** The Council has been successful in securing funding of £195,000 in 2011/12 from the Department of Health to provide grants to vulnerable people in the Borough to replace and upgrade central heating and home insulation. The specific nature of eligible works covered by the grants is set out in the project objectives section of this mandate. The Council was the only Borough Council in Leicestershire to have applied for the funding, the award confirmation being received on 13<sup>th</sup> January 2012.
