<b>Allerdale Borough Council</b>		Replacement 120 litre wheeled bins are charged at £39.10 each, with a 240 litre bin costing £46.93 (2010/11 prices).		
<b>Barnsley MBC</b>		The Council does not charge for replacement bins, but does charge £15.00 for delivery. Alternatively, residents may collect the replacement bin for free.		
<b>Bassetlaw District Council</b>	All new properties have to purchase bins. Sometimes this is done through the builder, although not very often. In the main, it is the new householder who has to purchase bins. Bins belong to the householder, so it is possible that somebody may bring their own Bassetlaw District Council bin with them from their previous property. Only BDC bins, with the Council name on them are emptied. Bins of the wrong colour, or from other authorities, would not be emptied. The cost of both a green residual refuse bin and a blue recycling bin is £28.30 (2010/11 price).	Bassetlaw charges all residents for replacement bins, unless they have "died" through wear and tear, or been damaged by crews when emptying. If, say, a lid were to come off, the chances are that the bin would be replaced free of charge, unless that particular household damaged bins on a regular basis.

<b>Broxtowe Borough Council</b>	In accordance with the Provision of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 it was decided to charge a single payment for the first time provision of wheeled containers to new properties constructed after 1999. The cost of 2 x 240 litre bins is £52.00 (2011/12 price). Bins remain the property of the Council.	The Council does not charge for damaged, vandalised, lost or stolen bins.

<b>Harrogate Borough Council</b>		The householder is charged for replacement or repairs for other damage, lost or stolen bins. The Council charges £7.50 (delivered) for a replacement box, and £4.30 (delivered) for a box lid.		
<b>Hart District Council</b>		The Council charges for the replacement and delivery of black, domestic residual waste bins and all Eurobins, regardless of colour, unless they are damaged during collection. Residents are not charged for blue recycling bins		
<b>High Peak Borough Council</b>	Wheeled bins for new properties are charged at £25.00 each, including delivery and VAT.	If a bin were to be damaged during emptying, it is replaced free of charge.		

<b>Hyndburn Borough Council</b>	New developments have to pay for containers. They are advised of this at planning stages.	No charge		
<b>Kettering Borough Council</b>	The Council charges for bins on new developments, which the Council is making part of Planning Conditions or 106 agreements. The Council owns bins, but may transfer ownership to householders when the policy of developers paying for bins for all new properties is introduced. At present, bins belong to the property. Only bins supplied by the Council are emptied.
