## REPORT OF HEAD OF CENTRAL SERVICES

### **COUNCIL TAX 2013/14**

### 1.0 PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1 The purpose of this report is to enable the Council to calculate and set the Council Tax for 2013/14 as required under the Local Government Finance Act 1992. The Leicestershire County Council figures are subject to approval at their meeting on 20 February 2013.

## 2.0 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 That the Council note the calculations and set the Council Tax for the year 2013/14 made in accordance with regulations set out in the Local Government Finance Act 1992.

### 3.0 **KEY ISSUES**

- 3.1 Members are reminded of the revised calculation of the Council Tax Base following the abolition of Council Tax Benefit and the introduction of a Localised Council Tax Support Scheme which took into account the Technical Changes to Council Tax as introduced by the Local Government Finance Act 2012 with effect from 1 April 2013. Reference to this was made in the Council Tax Base 2013/14 report approved by the Policy, Finance & Administration Committee on 23 January 2013. These changes result in an adjusted lower Tax Base figure for each of the Parish Councils and Special Expense areas.
- 3.2 Since the meeting of Full Council held on 6 February 2013 the precept levels of other precepting bodies have been received. These are detailed below:

### 3.2.1 Parish Councils

The Parish Council Precepts for 2013/14 are detailed in Appendix A and total £479,804. The increase in the average Band D Council Tax for Parish Councils is 12.33% and results in an average Band D Council Tax figure of £52.13 for 2013/14. Parish Councils are not subject to the requirements of the referendum rules.

# 3.2.2 Leicestershire County Council

Leicestershire County Council met on 20 February 2013 and set their precept at £18,599,077. This results in a Band D Council Tax of £1,063.00. The actual payment will be adjusted by a contribution towards a Collection Fund deficit of £165,776 for 2012/13.

## 3.2.3 Police & Crime Commissioner for Leicestershire

At the Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland Police & Crime Panel meeting on 30 January 2013, the Panel resolved to support the Police & Crime Commissioner's proposal to set their precept at £3,042,256. This results in a Band D Council Tax of £173.87. The actual payment will be adjusted by a contribution towards a Collection Fund deficit of £27,116 for 2012/13.

### 3.2.4 Leicestershire Combined Fire Authority

Leicestershire Combined Fire Authority met on 13 February 2013 and set their precept at £1,021,400. This results in a Band D Council Tax of £58.38. The actual payment will be adjusted by a contribution towards a Collection Fund deficit of £8,324 for 2012/13.

- 3.3 The following amounts for the year 2013/14 are calculated in accordance with the regulations made under Section 31B of the Local Government Finance Act 1992, as amended by the Localism Act 2011:-
  - (a) 17,496.8 being the Council Tax Base for the whole Council area (Item T in the formula in Section 31B).
  - (b) The Council Tax Base for dwellings in those parts of the Council's area to which a Parish precept relates:

These being the amounts of its Council Tax base for the year for dwellings in those parts of the Council's area to which one or more special items relate (i.e. tax base for parish's including Melton Mowbray itself).

- 3.4 The Council Tax requirement for the Council's own purposes for 2013/14 (excluding Parish precepts) has been calculated at £177.74.
- 3.5 The following amounts are calculated by the Council for the year 2013/14 in accordance with Sections 31 to 36 of the Local Government Finance Act 1992:-
  - (a) £30,625,729 being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 31A(2) of the Act taking into account all precepts issued to the Council by Parish Councils (i.e. gross expenditure including parish precepts)
  - (b) £27,036,071 being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 31A(3) of the Act. (i.e. gross income including government grants)
  - (c) £3,589,658 being the amount by which the aggregate at 3.5(a) above exceeds the aggregate at 3.5(b) above, calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 31A(4) of the Act, as its Council Tax

requirement for the year (Item R in the formula in Section 31B of the Act). (i.e. Council Tax requirement for general, special expenses & parish precepts)

- (d) £205.16 being the amount at 3.5(c) above (Item R) divided by Item T (the amount at 3.3(a) above, calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 31B of the Act, as the basic amount of its Council Tax for the year. (i.e. Band D average Council Tax including general expenses, special expenses and parish precepts).
- being the aggregate amount of all special items referred to in (e) £956,738 Section 34(1) of the Act. (i.e. total Council Tax from all special expenses areas plus parish precepts)
- (f) £150.48 being the amount at 3.5(d) above less the result given by dividing the amount at 3.5(e) above by Item T (3.3(a) above), calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 34(2) of the Act, as the basic amount of its Council Tax for the year for dwellings in those parts of its area to which no special items relate. (i.e. Band D Council Tax for general expenses only)

# (g) Part of the Council's Area

being the amounts given by adding to the amount at 3.5(f) above the amounts of the special item or items relating to dwellings in those parts of the Council's area mentioned above divided in each case by the amount at 3.3(b) above, calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 34(3) of the Act, as the basic amounts of its Council Tax for the year for dwellings in those parts of its area to which one or more special items relate. (i.e.
