Background

Choice Based Lettings is seen as a more open and transparent way of letting properties as applicants can actually see which properties are available and are invited to express their interest by placing a bid.

To enable Melton Borough Council implement choice based lettings, a partnership of local authorities and registered social landlords has been formed to develop and implement a sub regional choice based lettings scheme which spans Leicestershire. This partnership includes, Harborough District, Charnwood Borough Council, Blaby District Council, North West Leicestershire District Council and Oadby & Wigston District Council. All registered landlords who have properties in the Leicestershire area have been involved in the project. The aim is to have the system up and running by November 2010.

Project objectives

To meet key priorities:

- To improve housing services in Melton
- To meet the housing needs of vulnerable groups
- To support the delivery of the Sustainable Community Strategy
- To maximise the use of available resources
- To reduce the number of homeless applicants in temporary accommodation

Scope

To develop a system that has an element of choice within the allocation process.

It systems will need to be compatible, as well as allocation policies across the sub-region.

Constraints

It will be an issue; however, the working group has spent many months in securing a system that will work across the sub-region.

Outline Business Case (reasons)

Current system is based on need, however with no element of choice, so applicants are offered properties based on position on the waiting list, which means applicants accepting properties they do not really want.

This has shown to significantly impact the turnover of properties.
