Compact Leicestershire – The Leicestershire Refresh

The Leicestershire Compact that was launched in June 2003 formalising the relationship between Leicestershire County Council and the Voluntary Sector has served us all well. However, it is now time to take a look at what we have achieved to date and how we can build on this. We also need to ensure that the Compact reflects the new national Compact Guidance and addresses local issues and opportunities in this time of economic and social change.

The refreshed Compact Leicestershire will raise a number challenges, not least that it aims to develop a whole area approach, (including District and Borough Councils), drawing all the sectors together in an agreement with the Voluntary and Community Sector (VCS).

We are planning to hold District/Borough consultation events, which will also provide the opportunity to consider the role of local Compact agreements (which a majority of Districts/Boroughs have in place) as part of this consultation process.

We hope that the refreshed Compact Leicestershire will make it easier to jointly commission services between the various statutory authorities and the VCS. We are also very aware that all of us are facing an ever increasing need to ensure value for money is at the heart of all commissioning and procurement decisions.

Your response to the consultation is very important. It will help us to identify all the areas that we need to work on together to ensure we have a thriving VCS in Leicestershire.
