1. Overview of policy/function being assessed

A. Outline: What is the purpose of this policy? (specify aims and objectives)

A group of Melton residents who want to change unused local land into a space where vegetables can be grown for people in the community. The aim is to transform the land so it is usable, to be able to educate families, groups and children on where vegetables come from and demonstrate ways to cooked and used the produce. Each person who contributes their time to project is able to take away what they put into it.

B. What specific group/s is the policy designed to affect/impact?

This project is designed for all to be able to participate in the project, ages, genders, religions, disabilities and those most in need.

Those families who are struggling with the cost of their food shopping can come and grow on the site so that they are able to use what little money they have on other essential things for their family. They also plan to help educate school classes and other local community groups on the food we grow and what can be done with it.

The group have been very proactive in making other residents aware of the project. This has been achieved through:

- Melton Times
- Twitter and other social medias

The group has been in contact with the Council, Environment Team, Legal Services and Ward Councillors.

Other organisations have been the voluntary and community sector (The Source, Princes Trust)

There has been door knocking in the area where the site is to be.

Allotments are difficult to come by with such high demand for them, and not everyone has a garden to be able to grow vegetables so this gives those people the opportunity to grow their own produce.

Data from the Source we are seeing an increase in food parcels being handed out therefore this project may support those most in need.

Project such as Eat Well Waste Less are identifying the need to supporting those who are living off minimum wage or struggling on benefits, and this project will support those groups, families and individuals.

There is no existing community garden.
