#### REPORT OF HEAD OF REGULATORY SERVICES

### **WARM HOMES GRANT FUNDING 2013**

#### 1.0 **PURPOSE OF REPORT**


- 1.1 To inform Members that following a successful bid for grant funding from the Department of Health in 2012 of £195k for making homes warm in the private sector, another bid (for £235k) has been submitted for funding in 2013.
- 1.2 To gain approval to spend the approved grant for this purpose, including the appointment of a temporary Technical Officer from this fund to roll out the programme.
- 1.3 To confirm that a condition of the grant is that the funding is to be spent before April 2013.

#### 2.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 2.1 That the project mandate and business case attached be approved, the business case is submitted to PFA (Policy, Finance and Administration) Committee, and approval is given that this scheme and funding of £235k is brought into the Capital Programme for 2012-13 (para. 5.2 refers) and:
- 2.2 That approval is given to appointing a temporary Technical Officer from this fund to roll out the programme (para. 5.2 refers).

#### 3.0 **KEY ISSUES**

3.1 The 2010 private sector house condition survey for Melton Borough Council identified excess cold as the main reason for failure of the Decent Homes Standard in the Borough of Melton.



3.2 In more detail these failures mainly relate to pre-1919 properties, mainly flats and terraced properties more often privately rented.

- In 2011, the Department of Health (DoH) offered the opportunity to bid for grants for Warm Homes. These were offered to County Councils. Leicestershire County Council (LCC) was successful in obtaining a grant for £120k; a portion of this should benefit the Borough of Melton. Melton Borough Council approached the DOH in acknowledgement of the above facts and they determined that we could submit a separate bid through LCC.
- 3.4 Melton Borough Council was successful in obtaining £195k for measures to improve warmth in private sector homes in Melton. This has funded 50 new central heating systems and levered in another £88k contribution by landlords, who had to match fund any approved works. In addition there were 400 insulation measures installed.

This has been a successful approach in the past to try and improve the living conditions of some of our more vulnerable (see project mandate for more specifics on the eligible works).

3.5 Approval is required to spend any funding as it needs to be progressed by April 2013.

#### 4.0 POLICY AND CORPORATE IMPLICATIONS

- 4.1 Increasing the number of Decent Homes is a Corporate Priority. These works will enable us to exceed our performance targets for the current financial year.
- 4.2 It enables partnership working with the Voluntary sector who will refer into the system.

# 5.0 FINANCIAL AND OTHER RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 This grant is in excess of any monies that were expected in this financial year, and is of benefit to Melton Borough Council and will improve properties in the Borough. It is hoped that the cumulative works will contribute to better results in future house condition surveys and improve the lives of those vulnerable people living in properties with no heating or inadequate heating.
- It is requested that the Committee approve the project mandate and business case attached and include the scheme/funding of £235k within the capital programme for 2012/13 subject to further approval by PFA. Furthermore, it is requested that approval is given for the appointment of a temporary Technical Officer to enable the work can be carried out. The grant conditions enable us to fund this.

### 6.0 **LEGAL IMPLICATIONS/POWERS**

6.1 There is no specific legal implication associated with this report.

#### 7.0 **COMMUNITY SAFETY**

7.1 Warm homes are safer homes, fewer accidents occur in warm homes.

### 8.0 **EQUALITIES**

8.1 The work will be targeted toward vulnerable households and those homes likely to be occupied by vulnerable households. It is based on private sector housing knowledge, intelligence and experience. An equalities impact assessment is attached.

### 10.0 **CLIMATE CHANGE**


10.1 Insulation measures will also be fitted and the boilers installed will be energy efficient (and better efficiency than any existing that is replaced).
