#### REPORT OF THE MONITORING OFFICER

#### REFERRAL FROM FULL COUNCIL: CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGES

## 1.0 PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1 The Governance Committee has been requested by Full Council (9 May 2012) to consider the changes to the Constitution in respect of the abolition of Overview, Scrutiny and Audit Committee, in line with the resolution by Full Council on 18 April 2012. The Constitution and its associated appendices are enclosed at Appendix A with the respective amendments highlighted.

## 3.0 **KEY ISSUES**

3.1 On 9<sup>th</sup> May 2012 Full Council was asked to approve a revised constitution taking into account various changes, including the abolition of Overview, Scrutiny and Audit Committee by Full Council on 18 April 2012. At that meeting a procedural challenge was made that the amendments to the constitution had not been reviewed in respect of the consequential changes. Full Council resolved to request the Governance Committee to carry out the review and consider the changes resulting from the Full Councils decision.
