To prevent crime and disorder	Yes	Noisily Festivals are closely linked to the Psychedelic Society which actively promotes the use of hallucinogenic drugs. https://noisilyfestival.com/noisily-the-psychedelic-society/). https://www.reddit.com/r/psytrance/comments/b6va62/can_anyone_explain_this_funny_experience_i_had_at/ . And effectively markets itself as a festival of drug use. Many appear to go there for their first experiences of drugs being persuaded it is a safe environment in which to do so. One festival goer died as a result. The numbers involved would overwhelm any local policing response to any crimes at or around the festival. Given the high levels of drug use local (and wider) roads would be populated by a high level of drug driving after the event. This would disturb nesting birds in the breeding season. It is a crime under the Wildlife and Countryside Act of 1981 to disturb breeding birds and damage wildlife. In addition Terrace Hills Pasture is a Site of Special Scientific Interest. The site proposed lies within the impact risk zone to this SSSI. Breeding birds include Red Listed Woodcock, Amber Listed Goshawk plus Snipe, Raven and many tits and finches. Several days and nights of continuous disturbance would cause many to abandon nests. A LICENSE HAS ALSO BEEN GRANTED FOR A 4 DAY EVENT AT FROG HOLLOW. WE CANNOT ALLOW ANY MORE FESTIVALS IN THE VALE OF BELVOIR WHICH WILL ALREADY BEEN UNSAFE DUE TO THE FROG HOLLOW EVENT WHICH MAY OVERLAP WITH THE PROPOSED FESTIVAL.
