<b>Public safety</b>	Yes	<p>Long Lane where the proposed car parking will be is a 60mph (national speed limit) road. There have been numerous accidents on this road and having this number of cars pulling out onto such a quick road is a potential threat to public safety.</p> <p>At any time of the year rainfall can make the woods and the land at the base of the woods extremely wet and boggy (and slippery). Having walked through the woods throughout the year it can become dangerous and slippery. Should an accident happen the location is very difficult to access by the emergency services as we have seen recently during a large search and rescue operation for a missing person.</p> <p>All the photos of previous events show level woodland settings and working farms which are much more geared up to this type of event.</p>
<b>To prevent public nuisance</b>	Yes	The timings of the performances and licence application is unacceptable for surrounding villages. My wife is a nurse and works shifts - people need to be able to get a good night's sleep to be able to work
<b>To protect children from harm</b>	Yes	<p>The woods are used by children including my son. I would be worried about him going biking up through the woods during and after the event in case what he might find left by the revellers.</p> <p>Again if this was an isolated working farm like previous hosts, it would be less of a worry but the woods are a place for quiet reflection, leisure and wildlife to benefit.</p>

<b>Please suggest any conditions that could be added to the licence to remedy your representation or other suggestions you would like the Licensing Sub Committee to take into account (see note 2).</b>	The woods in question have remnants of ancient woodland indicators - I would hope the application will consider the environmental impacts this festival can have on a threatened habitat.
