Waterfield Leisure Centre Improvement	100	100	Essential improvement works are required at the Waterfield Leisure centre to address roofing issues totalling £77k which have arisen and resulted in the closure of the swimming pool for a period of time. These works will be funded from the Waterfield Leisure centre sinking fund. This is additional to previous ventilation works 0 required as part of the reopening of facilities undertaken earlier in the year at £23k
Asset Development Programme	285	285	Architects and a project manager have been identified and fee quote provided at £67k for a costed design package for first phase including a number of options. We are looking to confirm instructions at the end of January 2022. An architect had also been instructed, and the design work has been completed, covering options for the development of cattle market north site subject to sale to a developer and planning consent, this has been used to inform an external RICS valuer of the likely unit numbers subject to planning. Architects, as part of their quote, have reviewed a number of sites for indicative schemes. Design options will be undertaken which will inform costings and appraisals for future development. Initial investigations have begun which will inform the works required and the design team will put a proposal together for approval. Significant work has been required to temporarily empty the drainage system, which is 100% surcharged with heavily contaminated water discharge, this necessary to allow for the completion of the CCTV survey and this has had an impact on project costs, potentially a cost overrun of £30k, this work and the CCTV survey will be complete before the end of January and the design team will finalise a design to be submitted to the statutory authorities in February for approval. Engagement with the waste site operator and lessee Biffa will commence January / February in the context of lease repair obligations for the existing drainage with a view to recouping an element (as yet unknown) of the costs for this project. This project will be carried forward into 2022-23 with a request to increase the overall programme by £30k as outlined above
