To prevent public nuisance	Yes	<p>For the past few years between April and September, the white lion has had live music events on Saturday evenings, initially, the music did not seem so loud, with living in town I expected to hear some noise. The music appeared to get louder over the weeks in 2021, I contacted the White Lion in August 2021 through their Facebook page, and the response came across very helpful and they appeared concerned RE my concern. The music seemed very reasonable after this throughout the rest of the 2021 season. In April 2022 the music started again, this time it seemed much louder than in 2021, I could hear the thudding over my tv and on some occasions (as noted in the nuisance log sheet) I could hear word for word what the band was singing from inside my house with all windows and doors shut; on some nights, I could hear music until around 2am. One evening in August (4th), I was woken by loud music coming from the White Lion at 1am, this was the first time I was woken on a weeknight, this coincided with the White Lion's Facebook post of their LQBT event- being woken up by this effected my day at work due to disturbed sleep. For me, my sleep routine is important as I struggle with anxiety and depression. There are a range of pubs and venues in Melton town center, that I have never heard music from in the nearly 3 years I have lived here.</p> <p>I am not opposed to people having music on and having fun at an acceptable noise level (not being heard over my tv or being able to hear the singer word for word), however I feel there has been a real lack of consideration for those who do live in the town center throughout 2022. I expect to be able to relax in my own home and watch my tv without disturbance and to be able to go to sleep easily in the evenings – I eventually planned to spend Saturday evenings elsewhere due to the noise in 2022 and did actually consider moving.</p> <p>Video clips of the noise were sent as evidence on some occasions to David Martschenko- the white lion often did 'live' videos on Facebook of their music events, this is how I could tell the music was coming from their premises, as I could hear from my house what they were displaying through their live Facebook video.</p> <p>I am unable to attend the committee meeting on the 24th of February, however I would like my statement to be heard, and I would be more than happy to answer any questions or clarify anything I have written over the phone or at another time, when it does not clash with my work commitments.</p>
