7. Decision Taken:

To procure a replacement woodchipper to enable the Environmental Maintenance team to efficiently deliver a service that complies with health and safety regulations.

8. Reasons for Decision:

The previous woodchipper had become obsolete and didn't comply with the current risk assessment. it was a domestic chipper that had limitations on material sizes and volumes with a manual feeder. The chipper was sold early 2023 along with several other pieces of equipment that were no longer fit for purpose or complied with health and safety.

A new woodchipper was sourced in line with procurement rules, that meets the specifications required, including a self-feeder, eliminating the need for operatives to manually feed the material, reducing the risk of injury.

When Environmental Maintenance complete shrub and tree work, the material is taken to an on-farm composter in Scalford to be processed and disposed of. A new chipper would enable the team to chip wood on site, which will eliminate the need to travel, reduce fuel consumption and improve efficiency within the team.

The team need to be reactive to carry out tree work in emergency situations, such as wind-blown trees and trees that present a health and safety risk to property or members of the public. An onsite chipper is required for these eventualities to ensure the team have the equipment to deal with these incidents.

The wood chippings produced will be used on our land, for flower beds, allotments and to improve the quality of the soil. Friends of Melton Country Park group will also use the material for various projects within the park.

9. Authority / Legal Power:

The Director for Housing and Communities has delegated authority to take any decision in relation to the functions within their area of service responsibility as detailed within the constitution. This includes the Waste and Environmental Management Services.

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11. Alternative options available / rejected:

The following options were considered and rejected: -

- 1. Continue tree and shrub work without a woodchipper Higher fuel consumption, inefficient use of resources and materials.
- 2. Hire a woodchipper Significant hire costs with a minimum hire rate duration. Limited availability locally and no guarantee of availability in emergency situations.

12. Implications:

Legal	The Council has the power to enter into contracts in order discharge its functions (Local Government Act 1972, s111 and the Local Government (contract) Act 1997, s1).
