7. Decision Taken:

1. To approve the grant allocation to Melton Borough Council from Sport England for £120k and enter into the associated legal grant agreement with Sport England to obtain Swimming Pool Support Funding.

8. Reasons for Decision:

Cabinet on 29 November 2023 approved the funding allocation for the leisure project with reference specifically made to the Swimming Pool Support Fund Grant having been applied for.

The Council were successful in the application and have been awarded £120k.

Approval of the grant and entering into a legal grant agreement allows the Council to be given £120k from Sport England to improve our leisure asset at Waterfield Leisure Centre. Specifically Solar PV & Pool Covers. The funding grant is 100% of the total of costs of these energy efficiency works, and requires no funding from the Council.

9. Authority / Legal Power:

The Director for Housing & Communities/Deputy Chief Executive has delegated authority to enter into the grant agreement pursuant to the Melton Borough Council Constitution - Chapter 2 Part 4 Officer Scheme of Delegation.

Cabinet on 29 November 2023 (exempt item) approved the allocation of funding for the Leisure Project and made reference to the application of the Swimming Pool Support Fund Grant.

Reject the grant agreement; this would impact on the Council being able to deliver energy efficiency improvements (i.e. Solar panels & Pool Covers) to reduce Waterfield's utility usage and carbon footprint.

12. Implications:

	Legal	The Council has the power to receive grants from organisations using its general power of competence in section 1 of the Localism Act 2011. All grant conditions must be complied with to avoid unexpected financial implications for the Council. The Council has the power to enter into contracts in order discharge its functions (Local Government Act 1972, s111 and the Local Government (contract) Act 1997, s1). The Local Government Act 1972 requires the Council to have regulations for how it enters into contracts. In addition to complying with all relevant UK and EU legislation every contract entered into on behalf of the Council must also comply with the Council's Contract Procedure Rules and the Council's Financial Regulations	
	Finance	The Council will be receiving £120,157 from Sport England's Swimming Pool Support Fund (SPSF) to support improving Melton Borough Council Leisure facilities. The funding must be spent on energy efficiency improvements, as per the funding bid, which were solar PV and pool covers at Waterfield Leisure Centre.
