1.0 **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

2.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

3.0 KEY ISSUES

3.1 Background

Following on from the decisions of the Extraordinary Council meeting held on 8 May 2018 and this Committee's involvement in the Governance Review prior to that meeting, the Governance Development Group ('the Group') has met regularly and undertook extensive research and consultation on the principles of good governance and potential decisionmaking structures. The Group concluded its review of alternative governance models in October 2018.

3.2 Extraordinary Council Meeting – 21 November 2018

The Group has concluded that the current Committee system does not provide the Council with the right structure to achieve our strategic vision and commercial aspirations. This conclusion was based upon a thorough assessment of the alternative governance options and consideration of how best to meet the following objectives:

- To ensure public accountability with clearly identified responsibilities for members
- To increase engagement with stakeholders and the public in policy development and decisions that affect their area
- To ensure that there is effective review and challenge of our decisions
- To make quicker decisions when needed so as to fulfil our aspirations to be more agile and commercial.

Therefore as Chair of the Group, the Leader is to present the Governance Development Group's findings at an Extraordinary meeting of the Council to be held on 21 November 2018. The report is attached as follows :-


