To prevent crime and disorder	Yes	Harby has suffered unduly with Anti social behaviour (ASB) over the past 7 years, with a significant volume of 101 calls due to numerous problems with young adults in the age range of 16 to early 20s. This has stemmed from a group of around 20-30 people, There is significant concern that an event which is due to attract 2-300 times this number of individuals in the same demographic will lead to further ASB in the area.
Public safety	Yes	I understand through press coverage that the organisers, via a different Company with the same directors (Detonate UK Limited), have previously run this event (2016) which was ended prematurely due to a "life threatening crush" and an "angry and frustrated crowd". I further understand that, in February 2019, a license to run this very event was refused by Nottingham City Council as they "did not have confidence it would be run safely". How, therefore, can MBC be sure that this will be run safely - it may be a different Company but it is clearly the same people and the same event.
To prevent public nuisance	Yes	The suggested location is serviced by one road, which connects Harby &Langar. There is great concern at the volume of traffic that would come through 2 villages & the liklihood of parking issues. in addition, there are zero transport links to the location & there is a possibility that a high number of intoxicated young adults will find their way into the villages to attempt to call taxis etc, meaning the chances of ASB in the aftermath is high. There is a large running event taking place in Harby the very next morning, meaning any spill over / parking problems could severely affect this event. Finally, the noise level from a drum and bass all-day event would be significant & certainly enough to cause distress to residents based approx 1-2 miles from the event.
To protect children from harm	Yes	Note the issues at previous festival in 2016, where, according to press articles, there was a crush which "caused metal barriers to twist and buckle" and people caught up were "unable to breathe". Given that this event is aimed at 18-24 year old (I understand) then there is a high concern here. Also, if intoxicated teenagers are left with no way of getting hon then they could be out in the "middle of nowhere" in the middle of the night. There is limited to zero mobile phone signal in the area at times and this could lead to a significant incident.
