

General Exception Notice

Pursuant to the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012 Notice of Key Decision

Decision to be taken and by whom

- 1. To exercise the discretion afforded by s172 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 towards breaches of planning control in a supportive manner from 4th July 2020 until 30th September 2020 where it relates to temporary uses of land and structures (e.g. marquees) associated with the recovery of the hospitality sector;
- 2. To take enforcement action under the above legislation only where there is a serious impact upon safety, environmental or amenity interests.

Reasons why this is Key Decision

It will have a significant impact on two or more wards

Why was not included in the Notice of Forthcoming Key Decisions and why it would not be practicable to defer the decision

The Government Guidance is changing at a fast pace and at short notice and in order to support the hospitality industry it is imperative that the decision is implemented in time for the anticipated opening date of 4th July 2020. This date of 4th July 2020 is still subject to confirmation by Central Government, but the decision is being made in order to be prepared and able to support pubs and other establishments to make 'overspill' arrangements such as the erection/use of temporary structures (e.g. marquees) and use of adjacent land, as soon as they are able to do so.
